



Registering for CITI Training: WSU Required Modules Required for All Key Personnel

Key Personnel

Key personnel are defined as any persons engaged in the collection of data or persons who will have access to data through intervention or interaction with participants, including the consent process, or, in any capacity, have access to participant identifiable private information. All key personnel are required to complete relevant Collaborative Institutional Training Initiative (CITI) online modules.

Registration

- CITI website, www.citiprogram.org
- Select “Register” located in top right hand corner of the page.
- Select Organization Affiliation –Wayne State University – Detroit, MI
- Personal Information – Complete all fields with an asterisk.
- Create your Username and Password with Security Question and Security Answer
- Gender, Ethnicity and Race (disclosure is not required)
- Answer questions about CEU credits
- Complete information requested by WSU –
 - Any email address can be used but an institutional email address is preferred
 - Employee number and campus address are not required.

Select Curriculum

WSU requires three sets of modules for all key personnel.

Q #1 - **Basic Course in Human Subjects Research is required.**

Choose a learner group, as applicable.

Q #2 - Good Clinical Practice is not required, choose Not at this time.

Q #3 - **Health Information Privacy and Security (HIPS) Course is required.**

Choose the Information for Investigators learner group.

Q #4 - **Responsible Conduct of Research (RCR) Course is required.**

Choose a learner group, as applicable.

Q #5 - Conflicts of Interest Course is required if submitting a disclosure form to the FCOI committee.

Q #6 - Export Controls course is recommended if conducting international research.

Q #7 - Laboratory Animal Welfare course is not required by the IRB.

Q #8 - Student or Investigator Core Course in the RCR is not required by the IRB.

Q #9 - Conducting Clinical Trials of Medical Devices course is recommended if applicable.

Complete Registration and Complete Training

- Once registration is complete, the Main Menu page will appear.
- The main menu status must show “Passed” for each course in order to satisfy requirements.
- Modules can be completed at a later time if necessary.
- The three required modules will take 3 hours on average to complete. This time will vary based on how much time an individual spends reading the training material.
